Because the specific patterns of human interaction in which we are embedded in daily living have a profound influence on our experiences and mental well-being, a shift in focus from the personal to the interpersonal is extremely relevant to psychiatric assessment and treatment. In this interactive workshop, participants will explore some of the complexities of human relationships revolving around clinical mental health problems and initiatives toward solutions. The workshop will provide a systems-oriented framework for inquiring, understanding and intervening patterns of interaction to working relationally with families with mental health challenges. A map that orients both therapists and families in their efforts toward patterns of wellness will be introduced. The ideas of the relational practice approach to mental health care will be richly illustrated with clinical materials.

- 2. To learn the skills of listening-and-talking relationally; and
- 3. To distinguish and assess interpersonal patterns of interaction.
